The best time for seeing the paintings is around the middle of the day, so we'll have our visits and talks before lunch, between 11.15 and 1.00 pm.

Instructions

Sandham Memorial Chapel, Harts Lane, Burghclere, Newbury RG20 9JT

For most people the simplest route will be to follow the A34 northwards towards Newbury, turning off at the Tot Hill roundabout ("Newbury and Thatcham"). At the top of the slip road turn right across the dual carriageway and right again towards Burghclere. After a quarter of a mile turn left at the T Junction along Harts Lane and the Chapel is on your left with parking directly opposite.
